Notice God keeps his covenant of love with those who 'continue wholeheartedly in His way'.

What does it mean to be 'whole hearted'?

The Hebrew understanding of 'the heart' included the emotions, but it also involved the mind, the conscience and the will. It means everything that is going on inside of you. All the men and women whom God chose to use greatly had weaknesses and made mistakes. But God saw their hearts were turned towards him. It is your heart that matters. Your heart lies 'open before the Lord' (Proverbs 15:11, 1 Kings 8:39).

• What does God see when he looks at your heart?

Whilst we heed the challenge of verse 61 and recognise we are all works in progress, know that God loves you and approves of you and wants to fill you with his joy today. How does that make you feel?

Successive generations v25-26
